AMIA RESIDENT

A resident is any person who lives within the corporate city limits of Altoona. This is not to be confused with being an Altoona Area School District resident. City and School District boundaries are not the same. A nonresident is anyone who does not reside within the corporate city limits of Altoona.

Most programs/classes have different fees for residents and non-residents. Please note fees as listed by each program. The residents of Altoona, through property taxes, support the City of Altoona Parks and Recreation Department. Non-residents pay their fair share through an additional surcharge established by the Parks and Recreation Committee. The Altoona Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to remove anyone from our programs for falsifying information.

Registration begins March 12, 2024 Registration Form is on page 26. Registration will take place online or at the Parks & Recreation Office located in River Prairie Park. Parks & Recreation Office Hours are

7:30 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. Monday-Friday.

All program fees will be collected at registration. Please make checks payable to Altoona Parks & Recreation. Cash and credit card are also accepted.

Please do not ask us to exceed class limits, or put your child in the wrong age or skill level class. We try our best to accommodate everyone. Programs are designed according to an instructor/student ratio, and at an age level that will best benefit the student.

GENERAL INFORMATION

REFUND POLICY

A refund will be issued, less \$10.00 for administrative costs, if the Parks & Recreation Office is notified of your cancellation at least 7 days prior to the start of the program. No refund will be given after the start of a program. A full refund will be offered for any program cancelled by the Altoona Parks & Recreation Department.

REGISTER FIRST

Class registrations are not accepted at program sites. Persons must register prior to participation in any program.

CLASS CANCELLATIONS

A minimum number of participants are required before a class can be offered. The Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel a class or make schedule changes when enrollment does not meet the minimum number. Registering on the day of the program will not resurrect it - so please register early!

AGE REQUIREMENTS

A child must be the required age by the program start date. Grade is based on the upcoming school year. Please do not request to have your child put into a class that he'she does not belong. All age requirements are set to benefit the children and make instruction easier.






