Non-residents pay their fair share through an additional surcharge share through an additional surcharge established by the Parks and Recreation Committee. Registration begins March 10, 2025 Registration Form is on page 26. Registration will take place online or at the Parks & Recreation Office located in River Prairie Park. Parks & Recreation Office Hours are 7:30 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. Monday-Friday.

All program fees will be collected at registration. Please make checks payable to Altoona Parks & Recreation. Cash and credit card are also accepted.

Please do not ask us to exceed class limits, or put your child in the wrong age or skill level class. We try our best to accommodate everyone. Programs are designed according to an instructor/student ratio, and at an age level that will best benefit the student.

CLASS CANCELLATIONS

A minimum number of participants **are** required before a class can be offered. The Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel a class or make schedule changes when enrollment does not meet the minimum number. Registering on the day of the program will not resurrect it - so please register early!

AGE REQUIREMENTS

A child must be the required age by the program start date. Grade is based on the upcoming school year. Please do not request to have your child put into a class that he/she does not belong. All age requirements are set to benefit the children and make instruction easier.
